Register of supporters

Between 2019 and 2023 the people and organisations listed here raised over £150,000 to renew the bells and bell frame in the church of St Peter & St Paul, North Curry, Somerset.

The result would be a significant achievement at any time: during Covid-19 and the economic turmoil that followed, it has been quite remarkable.

Individuals have variously made contributions of money, time, energy and skills – sometimes all of those.

Organisations have contributed grants and supplied goods and services to support the appeal.

From the start, this has been acknowledged as a project of the village, not only of the church. Some 300 people are known to have donated cash; many more have attended events, bid in the online auction or slipped an anonymous gift into donation boxes.

The Parochial Church Council and the project team are deeply grateful to all of these supporters, who are listed in the pages that follow (or who wished to remain anonymous).

The project

The eight bells weighed just over four tons. The 19th-century wooden frame that held them had worked loose, weakened by 200 years of alterations, repairs, woodworm and simple old age. It moved when all the bells were rung. Change-ringing had to cease in 2021.

What is more, the original four bells, dating from 1811, were wearing out and at risk of cracking. The full ring of eight bells, including those cast in 1894 and 1953, had never been tuned as an harmonious set; and in fact it was physically impossible to re-tune some of them.

A new steel frame now spreads the weight of the bells more evenly and reduces wear on the structure of the tower. To instal it, all eight bells had to removed. This was a chance to re-cast them and tune them properly.

The eight 'new' bells weigh at least a ton less than before. This allows older ringers to carry on for longer. Youngsters can also ring the lighter bells with ease as they are trained to follow in the tradition of English change-ringing.

The metal of the old bells was melted down and used in the recasting. Recycling it is not only environmentally friendly: the bells had been recast in this way at least once before. Their history lives on in the new bells.

After a detailed competitive tendering process, John Taylor & Co. (the Loughborough Bell Foundry) was appointed to carry out the work. Other towers were visited to see and hear the work of the different bidders. As a result, Taylors was asked to copy the dimensions (a 'Gillett & Johnston profile') of the ring at Moretonhampstead. This profile is said to give bells a particularly clear and melodious sound – as has been confirmed with the new bells at North Curry.

The old bells were taken away, following a farewell service in the church, in October 2022 and the new ones installed in March-April 2023. Both occasions were covered by regional TV and radio.

On 30 April 2023 the new bells were dedicated in a service led by the Bishop of Bath & Wells, Rt Revd Michael Beasley.

On 6 May 2023 a full peal (three hours plus) was rung by experienced visiting ringers as part of the national ring to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III. And on the same day the local ringers rang the bells for a village wedding: the first time in three years this had been possible.

In June 2023 the Parochial Church Council stood down the Appeal of Bells Committee. The Appeal had raised more funds than were needed to replace the bells and frame. As had been promised to donors, the surplus funds were ringfenced 'to support bellringing and promote it within the local community; to train new bellringers; and to maintain and improve the bells over the years'.
